Understanding the nature of philosophical concepts in the German language

It is considered the nature of concepts in German philosophy. The problem of the nature of philosophical notions which is traditionally discussed from the point of view of analytical philosophy, gets a new expression because philosophical terms are treated as key words of some concept-sphere (linguacultural sphere). It is necessary to emphasize that the article demonstrates the ways and conditions of generating philosophical concepts, philosophical notions and transmission of their sense. The language of Philosophy differs as from the language of communication, being the first of all the language of thinking, as from the language of exact sciences where knowledge is shown as the result of thinking. The level of “freedom” in philosophical thinking to some degree depends on the word-forming and syntactical abilities of the language. Diversity of the language means promotes the development of the philosophical concept system. German philosophy demonstrates this idea vividly.
