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Analysis of phenomenon "abnormal" in Karl Marx's dialectics

The need to analyze the concept "abnormal" from a philosophic position has been considered. This phenomenon has been analyzed as well from the point of view of K. Marx's materialistic dialectics who claimed that any aspect of life was defined by material factors. Repeating the simplest movements of the thought from G. Hegel's book "Spirit phenomenology" and meaning that they are reflection of the matter's movement, K. Marx describes the matter movement of three principles on the basis of which the concepts of normal and abnormal are considered. The being of materialistic understanding of history of life is put above consciousness and moreover its definition contradicts historical development of the problem of the normal and the abnormal. In general the problem of the normal and the abnormal in K. Marx's dialectics receives an explanation of their interrelation and mutually denial, development and orientation
