Literary image in a poetic text and ways of its expression

The main way of expressing poetic imagery is stylistic devices, which most clearly manifest themselves in a poetic text. As a rule, any poetic text has a certain emotional background and intonation content, which draws various pictures in the reader's imagination that make up a single image. In the works, poets resort to a whole range of stylistic means, which enhances the expression of the text and expresses the artistic originality and skill of the author. Artistic imagery is divided into trope and non-trope. Tropes are the means of creating trope imagery, while non-trope imagery is presented in the form of syntactic (or rhetorical) figures of speech.
