The concept of good in the philosophical anthropology of V.I. Solovyov, I. Ilyin, N. Berdyaev: from “justification” to “a bad dream”.

The concept of goodness is considered in the works of V.I. Solovyov, I.A. Ilyin, N.A. Berdyaev. He traces the views of Russian philosophers in understanding the question of the essence and main characteristics of goodness. It is concluded that despite the formally visible contradictions of positions and acute polemics in solving this issue, thinkers imbue the concept of good with significant characteristics such as: ontology, rootedness in the divine and natural world, exclusivity of the moral nature of man, the need to protect and resist evil during the tragic course of the world historical process. The highlighted characteristics make it possible to emphasize the commonality of the ideas of V.I. Solovyov, I.A. Ilyin, N.A. Berdyaev in the essence of reproducing the meaning of the anthropological line in history.
